The texts for this course were generally difficult—especially just stylistically, they were not easy to read—and in all honesty I do not think I understood any of the readings which I did not write reflections on, at least before coming to the lectures. (This attests more to my laziness as a reader than to anything wrong with the syllabus, obviously, so this is all just by way of saying that the reflections were a very

helpful exercise!) They also took some of the onus off the final paper, grade-wise, which was nice.

The reading responses were surprisingly helpful for understanding that section of the material but I think I would have preferred a shorter paper instead so that I would have been more prepared for the final one. - 1. Lawrence's outside reading recommendations were always extremely relevant and he obviously knows just about everything when it comes to the topic of this course.
- 2. Lawrence is a very good lecturer, very clear, and really helpful in office hours. The class wasn't even supposed to be a lecture course so it's impressive that he stepped up the way that he did as a lecturer. I thought he was a great teacher and I learned a lot from this class. I didn't have any particular interest in Marx before taking the course, but Lawrence made a very persuasive case for the merit of his thought on issues you wouldn't usually think of Marx as central too—e.g. epistemology, philosophy of language. And Lawrence did an excellent job presenting and weaving both philosophical and historical threads, as well.
- 3. Clearly knew a lot about the material and explained it really well.
- 4. Lawrence structured the course well to give important background to Marx. He gave clear explanations and maintained a friendly atmosphere.
